




WEEKI INTRO THROUGH DAY 5

Share a time God called to you to something. Did you obey or disobey? Is there anything God is calling you to now that you can share with the group?






Name a time in your own life when disbelief in God's goodness has followed right on the heels of an act of faith? (If you feel comfortable, share your answer from Day 6)

Can you identify with Sarah? If so, how? Why do you hink Sarah and Abraham are included in the family tree of Christ?




DAY 11 THROUGH 15

Why aspects of God's character are on display in Rahab's story? Why do you think Rahab is included in the family tree of Christ?








What is significant about God choosing David (rather than his brothers) to be Israel's next king? What does this tell us about God's character?

What are some ordinary tasks of faith God is calling you to these days? (If you feel comfortable, share your answer from Day 21)

Joseph and Mary both display astonishing faith as they walk in obedience to what God has called them to. What stands out to you most about Joseph's story? About Mary's story?
